I understand that animals I am fostering for the Humane Society of Elmore County are the property of the shelter and are not mine to give away or place for adoption without the express permission of the shelter Director or Animal Care Manager. Foster parents will not make 'promises' of animals to any potential adopter as all adoption decisions will be made by the shelter staff.

All immunizations, de-worming medication, other medications, food, crating and bowls will be provided by the shelter.

Fosters are NOT authorized to take fostered animals to a vet without pre-authorization from the Shelter Director or Animal Care Manager and must take them to a vet designated by the shelter.

Foster parents must be able to bring the fostered pet either back to the shelter or to a designated veterinarian at various intervals for necessary treatments or follow-ups.

Falling in love with a fostered animal is an understandable outcome of fostering and something we completely understand. Fosters, however, must pay the same adoption fees as any other member of the public to adopt a pet from our shelter (this policy also applies to our staff).

Once puppies and kittens are eight weeks old, they are to be brought back to our shelter for the purposes of adoption. Fosters are encouraged to tell responsible pet lovers to come to our shelter and adopt one of their foster's or another pet but shelter staff has the final decision in regards to adoption approval.

I agree that the information I have provided is accurate, that all members of my household agree to being a foster family and agree with the policies set forth in this application and the HSEC Foster Care Manual.

Foster Parents may return foster animals to HSEC for any reason (other animals not liking; family emergency, other pets or fosters illness, or simply too much to handle), at any time.
